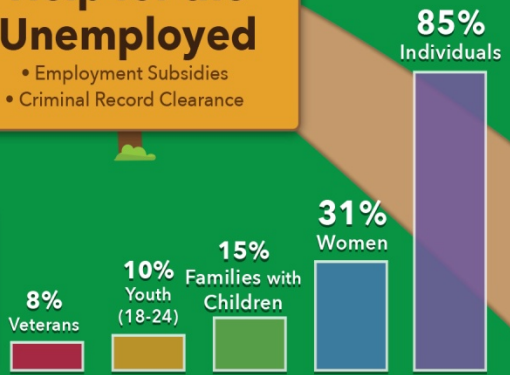
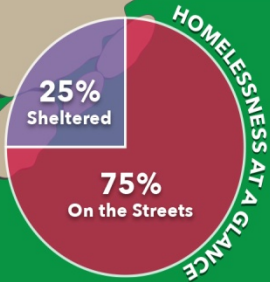

2. Eligibility issues with Subsidized Housing
3. Credit Resolution Advocacy
4. Criminal Expungement and Ticket Clearing
5. Assist Victims of Crime to access benefits
6. Driver License Reinstatement
7. Professional License Support
8. Government Benefits Advocacy
9. Criminal Expungements
10. Any legal services that remove barriers to housing, income and/or employment

INTERVENTION

Homelessness Prevention :

1. Eviction Defense
2. Preservation of Subsidized Housing and Rent Controlled Units
3. Landlord Dispute Resolution
4. Credit Resolution Advocacy

6. Criminal Expungement and Ticket Clearing
7. Other Housing Related Services
