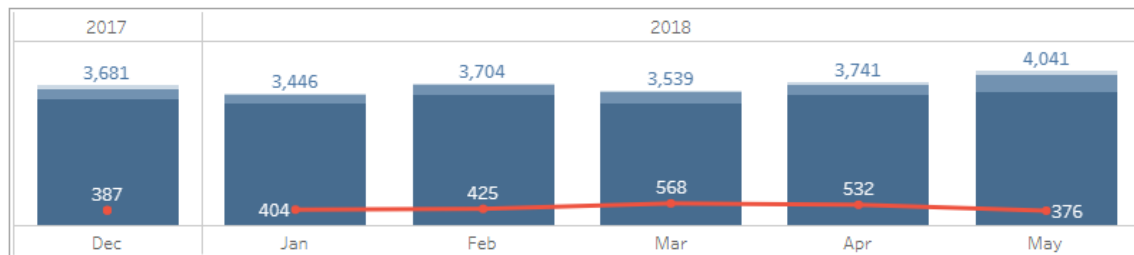

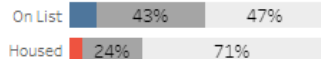

*Except for exit destinations, all charts reflect data for currently selected month only.*

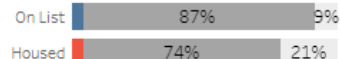
*Due to changes in data collection, sexual orientation and gender identity details are not available before April 2018.*



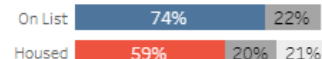
Of youth on the by-name lists, 10% are LGBTQ+, but 5% of those housed are LGBTQ+ youth.



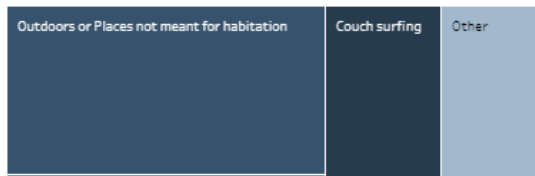
Of youth on the by-name lists, 4% are gender-diverse youth, but 4% of those housed are gender-diverse youth.



Of youth on the by-name lists, 74% are youth of color, but 59% of those housed are youth of color.



36% of youth report most frequently sleeping outdoors or places not meant for habitation.



Of the youth who exited homelessness, 42% went to non-time-limited destinations and 11% to time-limited destinations.

*Exit destinations reflect totals for 3 months prior to selected date.*

**Creating a common language to talk about progress towards ending youth homelessness**

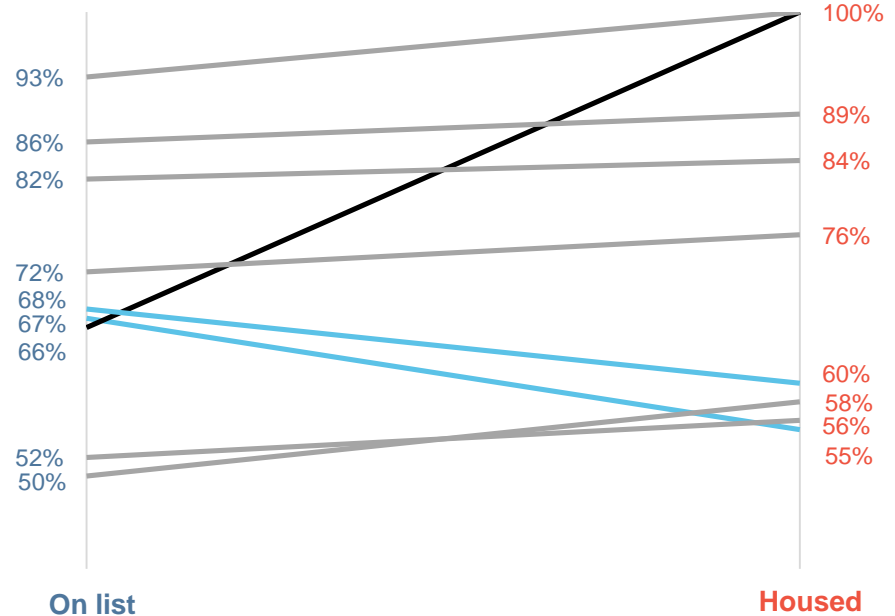
**Differences among communities drive differences in the data**

In most communities, youth of color are accessing **housing** in the same or higher proportions than youth of color on the **by-name lists**

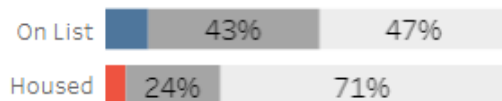




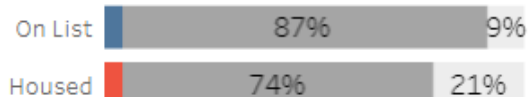

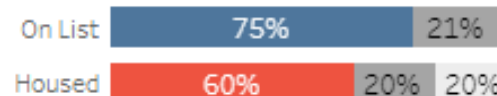
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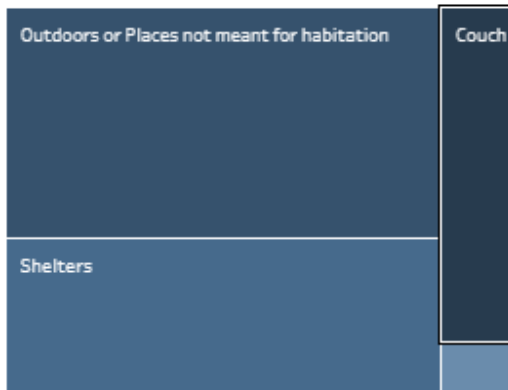
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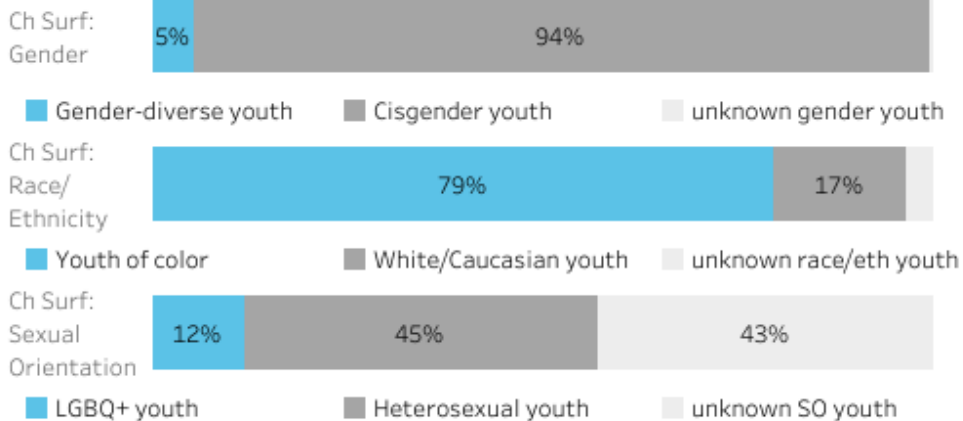


# Digging Deeper
