

### **CLEVELAND, OH**

TOTAL NUMBER 110

#### **GOALS**

- House 100 literally homeless youth (18-24 years old) with a special focus on those with Department of Children and Family Services involvement.
- Strengthen the systems that we have, so that as of Day 66 and forever more, no youth will age out into homelessness in Cleveland/Cuyahoga County.

#### **RESULTS**

- Housed 110 youth, primarily through family and friends and RRH
- Youth aging out of foster care during this period have rock-solid housing plans to prevent homelessness

### **AUSTIN, TX**

TOTAL NUMBER HOUSED 62

#### **GOALS**

- Permanently house 50 youth, ages 18-24
- At least 50% of those youths having been foster care involved.

#### **RESULTS**

- 62 youth housed
- 40% have been involved in foster care

### LOS ANGELES, CA

TOTAL NUMBER 456

#### **GOALS**

- Stably house 237 young adults, ages 16-24(5) years old who are experiencing housing instability or homelessness
- 58 are high acuity.

- 256 youth housed
- 66 were high acuity

### **BALTIMORE, MD**

TOTAL NUMBER 132

### **GOALS**

- 100 youth, aged 16-24, will move into safe and stable housing, with at least 20 of them being victims of sexual exploitation.
- 100% of youth that are exiting the DSS and DJS system will have a transition plan that addresses housing stability.

#### **RESULTS**

- 132 youth moved into stable and safe housing.
- Process for collaboration between homeless providers and DJS/DSS was begun at both the system leader and front-line staff levels.

### COLUMBUS, OH

TOTAL NUMBER HOUSED 83

#### **GOALS**

 Improve TAY-serving systems, starting with safely and stably housing 30% of single, unaccompanied youth and 80% of youthheaded families utilizing the shelter system

#### **RESULTS**

- 83 youth in were safely housed.
- Improved TAY-serving systems by increasing rates of successful youth exits from adult shelters (single adult TAY permanent housing exits increased from 8% to 21%, and family TAY from 61% to 69%).

### **HENNEPIN COUNTY, MN**

TOTAL NUMBER 436

#### **GOALS**

- 150 youth, ages 16-24, will exit homelessness into safe and stable *housing*
- 75% will be employed
  - <u>Note:</u> Housing Placement = Host Homes, TLP, reunification, market rate, RRH, and PSH; Employed = education, job training and credentialing (including GED and HS diploma), and paid internships

#### **RESULTS**

- 236 youth aged 16-24 have exited homelessness into safe and stable housing
- 57.2% are employed

### **LOUISVILLE, KY**

TOTAL NUMBER 115

### **GOALS**

- Safely and stably house 100 youth and young adults, ages 16-24
- Create 3-5 additional types of housing opportunities by testing alternative models with a focus on education, prevention and ongoing support

### **RESULTS**

- Safely and stably housed 115 youth and young adults ages 16-24 (23 of whom were under the age of 18 when they were housed)
- Tested 7 additional types of housing opportunities

### GOALS

- House 142 unaccompanied youth & young adults and families, ages 18 - 24.
- 50% of the youth & young adults will be identified as high acuity on the TAY-SPDAT
- 40% will self identify as a people of color and/or LGBTQ+.

### PALM BEACH COUNTY, FL

TOTAL NUMBER 121

- Housed 121 youth and young adults, ages of 18 to 24.
- 100% of YYA's housed were high acuity.
- 81% of the youth and young adults who were housed identified as people of color and or LGBTQ+

### **GOALS**

- Align resources to build a more themselves
- Connect these youth, ages 14 to 22 to a safe place to be within 12 hours of identification.

### **GOALS**

- House 50 literally homeless youth
- Improve percentage of young adults who transition to permanent solutions by implementing cross-sector housing Child Protective Services and juvenile

coordinated system to better identify and support the homeless youth who present

- transition plans for 75 youth aging out of justice.

#### **GOALS**

Build a coordinated system that gives 150 unaccompanied youth in crisis, ages 12-18 years old, a safe and stable place to be. This will empower youth and connect them to a variety of services and resources to support both immediate and long-term need,

#### **RESULTS**

- Adjusted their goal, given they over estimated the number of youth that would enter their system
- Housed 5 youth, which was total that presented as needing assistance during the 100 Davs

#### **RESULTS**

- Housed 51 youth
- Created 78 transition plans for youth in the juvenile justice or protective services systems.

#### **RESULTS**

Assisted 93 minor youth in finding a safe and stable place to be. (10 youth were placed in shelter, 72 were reunified and 11 were placed creatively)

### **GOALS**

- Stably house 70 TAY between the ages of 18-24 including but not limited to YYA's who are system involved and or pregnant/ parenting
- 10% will identify as LGBTQ+
- 20% will identify as people of color

- Housed 39 TAY's during the 100 Days. This was 34 more TAY's than they housed in the 18 Months prior.
- 8% identified as LGBTQ+
- 28% identified as people of color

### **MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FL**

**TOTAL NUMBER** HOUSED

#### **GOALS**

- Every 14-24 year old who enters through Coordinated Entry will be off the street within 2 days, and 85 young people will exit to safe, stable housing.
- 50 YYA entering through CE will be connected to training, education, or employment.

### **RESULTS**

- 28 YYA were safely and stably housed.
- 100% of all young people who entered through CE were off the street within 2 days.
- 52 YYA who entered through CE were connected to training, education, or employment.

### PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, MD

### **GOALS**

- 50 young adults will be safe and stably housed, of which 75% will be employed and/or in educational/training programs.
- 100% of students at three 2 and 4 year institutions who identify as homeless will be housed.

### SACRAMENTO, CA

### **GOALS**

200 YYA will be safe and stably housed with connections to support, of which 20% are pregnant and/or parenting youth, and 65% are experiencing stress or mental health symptoms that create challenges to becoming stably housed.

#### **RESULTS**

- 56 young adults were safely and stably
- 100% of students at 2 and 4 year institutions who identify as homeless have been housed.
- 80% of young adults who were housed were also employed and/or in educational or training programs.

### **GOALS**

- 100 youth will be safe and stably housed, with 20% of those youth being housed with new and/or innovative housing solutions.
- 50 system-involved youth will be prevented from entering homelessness.

#### **RESULTS**

- 313 YYA were safe and stably housed.
- 90% of YYA who were housed have been connected to support.
- 35% of YYA who were housed are pregnant or parenting.
- 53% of YYA who were housed are experiencing stress and/or mental health symptoms as a barrier.

### **SOUTHERN NEVADA/LAS VEGAS, NV**

### **GOALS**

- 75 youth will be safe and stably housed (with a plan).
- Improve the identification of unaccompanied youth under age 25 in 3 regions (centered around high school
- Assess 100% of youth within the system.

#### 91 youth were safe and stably housed. 46 system-involved have been prevented

- from entering homelessness.
- 10% of youth have been housed with new and/or innovative housing solutions.

### **GOALS**

- House 100 youth and young adults
- With at least 50% being systems-involved (engaged within the juvenile justice, foster care, chemical dependency, and behavioral health systems)
- Include at least 10 minors

#### **RESULTS**

- Housed 109 youth and young adults,
- 52% were systems-involved
- 43 of those housed were minors.

### PIERCE COUNTY, WA

TOTAL NUMBER 176

#### **GOALS**

- House 168 youth and young adults (twice the number of young people identified in the county's annual point-in-time count)
- At least 40% would identify as LGBTQ+, 40% would be youth and young adults of color, and 30% would be minors
- Develop 100 new successful housing options, including foster home opportunities, host homes, and new landlords

#### **RESULTS**

- Housed 176 youth and young adults
- 17% identified as LGBTQ+, 63% were youth and young adults of color, and 27% were minors
- Developed 175 new housing options

### KING COUNTY, WA

TOTAL NUMBER HOUSED 330

### **GOALS**

- House 450 youth and young adults,
- At least 60% would identify as LGBTQ+ and/or youth and young adults of color,
- House all 292 young adults who were unsheltered at the start of the challenge

- Housed 330 youth and young adults
- 76% of those housed were youth of color and/or identified as LGBTQ+
- Housed 54 of the original unsheltered young adults

### **GOALS**

- Create a register of all the "literally homeless" young adults, ages 16-17 who are not system involved
- Connect 100% of these young adults to a community advocate and resolve the homeless condition for 50% of them
- During the month of September, every 18-24 young adult who seeks shelter will receive and be connected to a safe and stable place to stay

- Identified 25 beds serving youth under 18
- Identified lead navigators from 3 organizations in order to coordinate outreach and engagement
- Through youth partnership, created a toolkit for shelter intake
- Increased collaboration and communication with DHS
